12 Refugees to Aurora, IL via Radical Love

Radical Love is partnering with Welcome Corps and World Relief to bring 12 souls (pictured above) out of Mae La Oon refugee camp in Thailand. The two families, whose extended family helped start Radical Love, have been in the refugee camp since 2005 and 2007; the children know no other life than in the camp.

Two teams – one for each family – are working to secure housing, furniture, a list of medical/dental/mental health professionals, and school and job information. Radical Love secured the funds needed (\$30,000) to supply these needed resources for our new neighbors. The volunteer teams will serve as the family's first friends and connectors to our community.

This project falls directly in line with our mission: To bring a community together to love and help one another.

Funds raised will support our new Welcome Corps initiative and our growing Radical Love programming.

The Story of Radical Love: How it all started By Ellie Lebron

Like most good ideas, ours started on a playground. As we watched our children run, a group of moms discussed the desire to love and serve neighbors in need, with our young children alongside us. We couldn't find such a place, so we made one: The Love Your Neighbor Club. It began with 7 families in 2017.

We connected with an elementary school in Aurora where many refugee children attended. We helped meet needs like school supplies, winter gear, Halloween costumes for the school parade, books to take home and keep, and food for long weekends. Word began to spread about our Club, and more families joined in the mission to help.

In 2019, I received a request from a community leader that was different: A woman in Aurora needed a friend. She was born in Burma, raised in a refugee camp in Thailand, and had recently lost her husband in a car accident. She was a stay-at-home mom with three young kids; her children were the same ages as my children. I couldn't say one word in her language (Karen), but I went to her home and sat with her. We cried together and talked a bit in broken English. A friendship formed and something inside me changed: I knew a refugee by name: Hser, and everything changes when you know someone by name.

Covid hit and we could no longer work through the school. God opened new doors, and I met more refugee neighbors, including a woman named ChiChi. Together, we talked about the need and desire of refugee women to learn English, but it proved difficult with young kids at home. In the spring of 2021, we began building a program called "Summer Friendship & Learning," which would bring together adults wanting to learn English with adults willing to tutor. We would have childcare and fun things for kids so everyone could come – both the children of the learners and volunteers.

Word spread about our English-learning program, and a local business wanted to fund what we were doing. But as a little club, we couldn't accept the money - and we weren't so "little" anymore; we had over 250 families wanting to help. The families represented churches from all over the Fox Valley, many of different faiths, some not attending church, but all wanted to be part of our mission. God spoke again, "Radical Love. Show my radical love." He surrounded us with all the right people at just the right time, and Radical Love formed as a 501c3 non-profit in May 2021.

As soon as we incorporated, we received the check from the local business that wanted to help. *It was the exact amount needed for our learning materials for the first summer.*

During the first summer, approximately 120 resettled refugees, volunteers, and children participated in our program. This summer, over 250 resettled refugees, volunteers, and children were part of our Radical Love program. We went from helping 1 school to serving neighbors in 12 schools and housing complexes. To date, there are 935 families reading this publication.

It is our mission to bring a community together – to love and help - by getting to know one another. *Everything changes when you know someone by name. It's how God knows and loves each one of us.*
